

The name Lenggong is said to come from a particular story about a man from Semang tribe who

tried to cut down a tree the size of 4 to 5 hugs. The man encountered difficulties cutting down the tree as the tree had buttress roots. Determined, he then worked on a ramp to cut it down.

Sparing no effort on the arduous task, finally the tree fell. However, it was unfortunate that the tree befall a slightly smaller tree, breaking it causing the log of the tree he cut to slant("terlanggong") on top of it. The slanting log was left there for a long time. Therefore, the place was named "Langgong". The pronunciation later changed to "Lenggong" due to their dialect and the name remains to the present day.

Another version of history narrated that the name was derived due to the environment of the area that seemed to be surrounded by walls and curved inward by the surrounding hills and mountain range. Therefore, the place was named "Lengkong" that eventually changed to "Lenggong".



The area was developed in 2014 as Laman Budaya. However, in 2022, it was remoulded to World Heritage Office to assist in management regarding World Heritage Site.

It also functions as a tourist information centre and Lenggong World Heritage Office. Any information regarding tourism in Lenggong is provided for the

Lenggong Valley Archeological Gallery. Lenggong Valley Archeological Heritage is in an area that was previously a palm oil plantation in Kampung Kota Tampan, Temelong district, Lenggong. The gallery contains exhibition gallery, administration office, meeting room and research room. Lenggong Valley Archeological Heritage Gallery is now administrated by Department of National Heritage under the governance of Ministry of Tourism and Culture

Tourist is anticipated to visit Lenggong Valley due to the attractions of being listed as World Heritage Site in addition to the aggressive advertisements by related agencies. However, frequent visits of large groups might inflict negative effects to the archeological sites and potent caves.

Therefore, Lenggong Valley Archeological Heritage Gallery is necessary as a mandatory entry for visitor registry, information acquirement and briefing on the code of conduct before stepping into the archeological site. Educational and informative interpretation material is also provided emphasizing the importance of appreciating and preserving Lenggong Valley. The material also need to be entertaining and interactive to ensure the experience is far from

Lenggong Geopark Gallery is located about 8km from Lenggong Town at the side of the road nearby the main road to Kg. Luat. The gallery was built in 2020 as one of the must-visit spot when travelling to Lenggong. Administrated by Minerals and Geoscience Department, it houses exhibition materials and information panel relevant to Lenggong Geopark. Aside from that, the gallery also provides information regarding geosites that serve as a tourism product and information on tourism activities in Lenggong. This gallery is also used as a hub for Lenggong Geoguide.

Tasik Raban located at Sungai Perak is a lake formed due to the construction of Chenderoh dams early 1928. Tasik Raban Lenggong is a very appealing and enticing lake filled with flora and fauna fit for vacation. It is also one of main attraction for visitors who like various water activities including fishing and kayaking. The lake is abundant with freshwater fishes such as giant gourami, river carp, crossbanded barb, bagrid catfish and tinfoil barb. Besides the breath-taking scenery, this lake is also where locals fish and carry out caged fish farming. It is also used as a filming location for international film, namely "Anna and the King" and "Operation Mekong"




Recreational Forest is located in Bintang Hijau forest reserve. Beautiful waterfall about 50 meters tall with clear flowing river make it very suitable for a stroll, relaxing and picnic on weekends. It is equipped with facilities like camping ground, multipurpose hall, prayer hall and washrooms for visitors who intend to extend their stay or various educational, recreational and leisure activities.It is situated in Bintang Hijau forest reserve 9km from Lenggong town. There are no admission fees and is accessible from 7am to 6pm. Operated by the Perak State Foresty Department.

Lenggong is one of venison and deer breed main producer in Malaysia. Lenggong is unique in raising the deer in free ranging system involving 5 pastures maintained by villagers and supervised by the Department of Veterinary Services. Aside from assuring income and improving local economy, deer farming also serve as tourism product through production of deer-based food, handicrafts and activities with the deer









The mosque has been repaired three times to what it looks like today. In the past, residents from Kampung Beng, Kampung Bukit Sapi, Kampung Luat and Kampung Labit also performed their Friday Obligations at this mosque.

Aki Aji Gallery is very much valued for antique lover with their own sentimental value. Aki Aji Gallery is located in Kampung Chepor, Lenggong, Perak 15km away from Lenggong town. This Gallery is an old house carried to its current location in 2019 with cooperation of the villagers. At the time, over 500 antiques collected from the result of individual findings and now a lot of people believe to keep their antique collection.

The gallery houses various antique collection such as iron, carpentry tools, telephone, iron pottery, and accessories used for wedding ceremony. There is also kitchen area with a variety of ancient cooking utensils and tableware that is popular during the pre independence age that can be counted as educational to the newer generation regarding revolution of object that is now more modern and easier.





Telaga Biru Spring geosite represented by several wells in Kampung Chepor. The well is used by the locals as water source to fulfill health related needs. The bluish spring that continuously flows (as if it is boiling) leads the local community to hold mystifying belief of it. Through observation of the locals, phenomenon where bubbles emerge is related to the earthquake activity in Sumatera. The water is composed of bicarbonate acid, calcium, potassium, sodium, sulphate, chloride, fluorite and traces of iron with pH and temperature of 7.6 and 26.7°C respectively. Due to the water source from deep down the ground, absence of suspended sediments and the water clarity make it appear a shade of blue. The well is used as exclusive water source for health and suitable to be developed as recreational tourism spot.

Archeological Heritage of Lenggong Valley

Archeological Heritage of Lenggong Valley (WALL) was recognised as World Heritage Site (TWD) by United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organisation (UNESCO) in 2012 under The Convention Concerning the Protection of the World's Cultural and Natural Heritage, 1972. The nomination was approved during 36th annual meeting of World Heritage Committee in Saint Petersburg, Russia. WALL is the 4th World Heritage Site in Malaysia and 953rd in the world.

One of most significant prehistoric evidence is the finding of human skeleton known as Perak Man in Gua Gunung Runtul that shook the archeological world, explored by the Centre for Archeological Research Malaysia, Universiti Sains Malaysia in cooperation with Department of Museums Malaysia

> Perak Man is the most complete skeleton in Southeast Asia that provided enormous information on lifestyle, belief, diet, technology, race, gender and disease during the Paleolithic Era. Buried in fetal position where the legs are bent and drawn up to the torso surrounded by food and his stone tools shows that Perak Man was highly respected by the community in that era. Perak Man passed away due to gingiva infection at the age of 45, about 20 years older compared to other people of the same era
